




Director, Environmental Health


MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must possess the following:

A current certificate as a Registered Environmental Health Specialist by the State of California and a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. college or university or a certified foreign studies equivalency AND, five years of management level experience that demonstrates the ability to perform the essential functions of the classification. Experience must include three years of experience with an Environmental Health Agency. Experience must have included at least one year of supervision.

Note: A master's degree or higher degree may substitute for a total of one year of experience and cannot be applied to the required one year of supervision.
