

The Communities

The Position

Under direction, the Hazardous Materials Inspector assists with the implementation and administration of the fire department's Certified Unified Program Agency and fire prevention programs. Responsibilities include a variety of technical duties in the regulation of hazardous materials and waste; performs related work as required.

The Hazardous Materials Inspector is a uniformed position within the Code Administration and Inspection Division of the Fire Department.

Typical Duties

- Regularly inspects users or generators of hazardous materials and wastes to ensure compliance with federal, state and local regulations.
- Reviews hazardous materials business plans to ensure compliance with governing regulations.
- Provides information to the public regarding the storage, use, and disposal of hazardous materials, and other fire and building code requirements.
- Investigates and seeks to resolve complaints regarding hazardous materials.
- Responds to emergencies involving hazardous materials and investigates hazardous materials incidents.
- Maintains a variety of records; prepares reports regarding inspection activities.
- Reviews building and other plans and inspects new construction for facilities using or storing hazardous materials.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

Will have the skills and abilities:

- See adequately to read blueprints and specifications and VDT's.
- Maintain balance on narrow platforms, climb ladders and stairs, and crawl in small spaces.
- Stamina to wear a fully encapsulated suit and self-contained breathing apparatus for up to 45 minutes while doing moderate physical work.
- Safely use chemical test apparatus, and personal protective equipment including Level A chemical protective clothing.
- Attend classes, seminars and conferences during working and non-working hours and work a flexible schedule including emergency overtime.

Education and Experience:

Any equivalent combination of training and experience that would provide the knowledge, skills and abilities required to perform the essential duties of the job. A typical way to do this may be:

Completion of Bachelor's Degree in Chemistry, Biology, Toxicology or a related field of science with core courses in Chemistry **or** education and experience that satisfies the Title 27 requirement for hazardous waste inspectors within one year of hire. And two years experience with environmental and/or life safety regulations involving the storage, use, handling, and/or disposal of hazardous materials. Two years experience responding to or handling hazardous materials emergencies is desirable. Experience as a government agency inspector is preferred.

License:

- Valid California Class A Driver's License.
- 832 PC (Penal Code) Certification must be obtained prior to completion of probation.
- Compliance with California Title 27 CCR Section 15260(d) (1) (A) and (B) prior to completion of probationary.
