Totten, District Attorney of Ventura County; (collectively, "the People"); and Defendant PARTY CITY CORPORATION, generally appearing through its attorneys, Tyreen G. Torner and David Faustman, Fox Rothschild LLP, hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

- 1. This Court may enter this Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment and Permanent Injunction ("Final Judgment") before the taking of any proof and without trial or adjudication of any fact or law;
- 2. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction over the matters alleged in this action and has personal jurisdiction over the parties to this Final Judgment;
- 3. This Final Judgment is a fair and reasonable resolution of the matters alleged in the People's Complaint;
- 4. Entry of this Final Judgment is neither an admission nor a denial by Defendant regarding any issue of law or fact in the above-captioned matter or any violation of any law;
- 5. The People and Defendant (collectively, "the Parties") waive any right to set aside the Final Judgment through any collateral attack, and further waive their right to appeal from the Final

Judgment.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties having requested this Court enter this Final Judgment, and the Court having considered the Final Judgment reached between the Parties, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED as follows:

#### 1. JURISDICTION

This Court has subject matter jurisdiction over the matters alleged in this action and personal jurisdiction over the Parties to this Final Judgment.

## 2. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTED CLAIMS

This Final Judgment is a fair and reasonable resolution of the Covered Matters (as defined in Paragraph 6 below) and is in the best interest of the public.

#### 3. **DEFINITIONS**

Except where otherwise expressly defined in this Final Judgment, all terms shall be interpreted consistent with Health and Safety Code section 25100 et seq. (Hazardous Waste Control Law), section 25500 et seq. (Hazardous Materials Release Response Plans and Inventory Law), and the regulations promulgated under these sections.

"Certified Unified Program Agency" or "CUPA" is defined in Health and Safety Code sections 25123.7(b) and 25404(a), and means the agency that, pursuant to Chapter 6.11 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code, and Title 27 of the California Code of Regulations, is certified by the California Environmental Protection Agency with the jurisdictional responsibility and authority to implement and enforce certain state environmental program requirements specified in Health and Safety Code section 25404(c)(1).

"Party City Facility(ies)" means the permanent stores at fixed locations that operate on a year-round basis within the State of California that Defendant formerly or currently owns or operates, or any respective successor corporation or assignee owns or operates subsequent to the effective date of this Final Judgment. Party City Facilities known on or about the effective date of this Final Judgment are listed in Exhibit A-1.

"Halloween City Facility(ies)" includes all Toy City locations and means stores which are formerly or currently owned, operated, licensed or leased by Defendant, within the state of California

or any respective successor corporation or assignee owned, operated, licensed or leased subsequent to the effective date of this Final Judgment. These stores are/were temporary retail facilities that operate/operated on a seasonal basis at locations subject to change from year to year. Halloween City Facilities known on or about the effective date of this Final Judgment are listed in Exhibit A-2.

"PC/HC Facilities" means all Party City Facilities and Halloween City Facilities combined.

"Participating Agency" means an agency that has been designated by the CUPA to administer one or more state environmental programs on behalf of the CUPA.

## 4. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

## 4.1. Applicability

The provisions of this injunction are applicable to Defendant, including its successors and assigns, and all persons, partnerships, corporations, and other entities acting under, by, through, on behalf of, or in concert with Defendant with actual or constructive knowledge of this injunction.

## 4.2. General Injunctive Provision

Pursuant to the provisions of Health and Safety Code sections 25181, 25515.6, and 25515.8, and Business and Professions Code section 17203, Defendant is permanently enjoined from violating Chapters 6.5 and 6.95 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code and the regulations promulgated under these chapters. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Final Judgment, nothing in this Final Judgment shall relieve Defendant from prospectively complying with any and all applicable laws and regulations, nor shall any term of this Final Judgment extend to Defendant's PC/HC Facilities outside the State of California.

## 4.3. Specific Injunctive Provisions

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code sections 25181, 25515.6, and 25515.8, and Business and Professions Code section 17203, Defendant is enjoined, restrained, and prohibited from doing any of the following:

- 4.3.a. Disposing, or causing the disposal, of hazardous waste at a point not authorized by law, in violation of Health and Safety Code sections 25189 and 25189.2;
- 4.3.b. Transporting, or causing to be transported, any hazardous waste to an unauthorized location in California, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25189.5;

- 4.3.c. Transporting, transferring custody of, or causing to be transported in California any hazardous waste unless the transporter is registered to transport hazardous waste, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25163;
- 4.3.d. Failing to determine if a waste generated at its PC/HC Facilities is a hazardous waste, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, sections 66262.11 and 66260.200(c);
- 4.3.e. Failing to properly manage, identify the date of accumulation, or label containers of hazardous waste at its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.34;
- 4.3.f. Failing to lawfully and timely dispose of all hazardous waste accumulated at each of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.34;
- 4.3.g. Unlawfully storing, handling, or accumulating hazardous waste, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25123.3 and California Code of Regulations, title 22, sections 66262.34 and 66265.173;
- 4.3.h. Failing to conduct inspections of hazardous waste storage areas at each of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, sections 66262.34 and 66265.174;
- 4.3.i. Failing to timely cause to be prepared and filed with the Department of Toxic Substances Control ("DTSC") a hazardous waste manifest for all hazardous waste that is transported, or submitted for transportation, for offsite handling, treatment, storage, disposal, or any combination thereof, from any of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25160(b)(3) and California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.23;
- 4.3.j. Failing to contact the owner or operator of a designated facility that was to receive hazardous waste from Defendant to determine the status of the hazardous waste, in the event Defendant has not received a copy of the manifest signed by all transporters and the facility operator within thirty-five (35) days of the date the waste was accepted by the initial transporter, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25160(b)(3) and California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.42;
- 4.3.k. Failing to timely notify the DTSC by filing an exception report concerning a treatment, storage, or disposal facility's failure to return any executed manifest, in violation of Health

and Safety Code section 25160(b)(3) and California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.42;

- 4.3.1. Failing to maintain copies of hazardous-waste manifests for three (3) years, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.40;
- 4.3.m. Unlawfully failing to segregate incompatible hazardous-waste items, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66265.177;
- 4.3.n. Failing to comply with employee training obligations pertaining to the handling of hazardous waste at its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66262.34(d) and 40 C.F.R. section 262.16(b)(9)(iii), or California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66265.16, whichever may apply;
- 4.3.o. Failing to properly manage, mark, and store universal waste at each of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of the standards for universal waste management found in California Code of Regulations, title 22, sections 66273.33 through 66273.36; or in the alternative, failing to manage such waste as hazardous waste, in violation of Chapter 6.5 and its implementing regulations in California Code of Regulations, title 22, including, but not limited to, section 66262.34;
- 4.3.p. Failing to keep a record of each shipment of universal waste sent from any of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66273.39; or in the alternative, failing to manage such waste as hazardous waste, in violation of Chapter 6.5 and its implementing regulations in California Code of Regulations, title 22, including, but not limited to, section 66262.34;
- 4.3.q. Failing to treat returned or discarded non-empty aerosol cans at its PC/HC Facilities as universal waste or hazardous waste, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66273.1 et seq.;
- 4.3.r. Failing to implement, maintain, or submit to the responsible CUPA, a complete hazardous materials business plan for each of its PC/HC Facilities, in violation of Health and Safety Code sections 25505, 25507, and 25508, and California Code of Regulations, title 19, section 2650;
- 4.3.s. Failing to implement, maintain, and comply with an employee-training program on hazardous materials, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25505(a)(4) and California Code of Regulations, title 19, section 2659;

- 4.3.t. Failing to immediately report any release or threatened release of a reportable quantity of any hazardous material from any of its PC/HC Facilities into the environment, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25510;
- 4.3.u. Failing to dispose of customer records without first shredding, erasing, or otherwise modifying the personal information in those records to make it unreadable or undecipherable, in violation of Civil Code section 1798.81.

## 4.4. Compliance Assurance Program

Pursuant to the provisions of Health and Safety Code sections 25181, 25515.6, and 25515.8, and Business and Professions Code section 17203, Defendant shall expend a minimum of \$212,000.00 DOLLARS (\$212,000.00) on compliance assurance programs described in this paragraph to augment the prohibitory injunctive provisions of this Final Judgment.

- 4.4.a. California Compliance Employee. Defendant shall employ at least one (1) full-time employee, or equivalent, responsible for environmental, health, regulatory, and safety compliance assurance at its PC/HC Facilities ("Full-Time Employee") for a period of five (5) years after the effective date of this Final Judgment. This Full-Time Employee may be employed by Defendant or a Defendant affiliate, subsidiary, or parent, and may be employed in Defendant's locations within or outside of California. The Full-Time Employee may also have other responsibilities not related to hazardous waste, including, without limitation, environmental, health, regulatory, and safety matters. Defendant shall make good faith efforts to continually staff this position, but it is recognized that there may be an occasional vacancy due to staffing transitions or other staffing interruptions.
- 4.4.b. Training. Defendant shall maintain proof the training required by California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66265.16 for employees employed as follows:
  - 4.4.b.1. For each training conducted to ensure compliance with Chapters 6.5 and 6.95 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code, Defendant shall maintain documentation sufficient to identify which employees received training, the nature of such training, on what dates and include the employee's signature acknowledging attendance at the training. Such records may be maintained electronically in a

manner that allows retrieval of the records upon request by governmental inspection within five (5) business days. This documentation is referred to here as the "Training Roster(s)."

4.4.b.2. Defendant shall not permit an employee to provide labor or services relating to the storage or disposal of hazardous waste if the employee has not received the required training, or more than one year has elapsed since the employee was last trained, as required by California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66265.16.

## 4.4.b.3. With regard to Party City Facilities:

- a. Defendant shall maintain a copy of the Training Roster evidencing each store management personnel's and each permanent employee's training at each Party City Facility within fourteen days (14) from the start of employment in that position. Such records shall be maintained where the employee provides any labor or services, or in the case of an employee who provides labor or services for more than one location, at the employee's primary work location, to be designated by Defendant, for a period of five (5) years from the date the training was conducted, regardless of the duration of the employee's employment. In the event that the Training Rosters are not available during a governmental inspection, Defendant shall provide the Training Rosters to the inspector by the close of the following business day.
- b. Defendant shall review the Training Roster on a quarterly basis to ensure each employee at the Party City Facility has received the training required under California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66265.16, and that less than one year has elapsed since the employee last received the required training.

c. Defendant shall promptly make available upon request by any CUPA Inspector, peace officer, agent of the Department of Justice, California Environmental Protection Agency, the DTSC, or District Attorney all Training Rosters for each Party City Facility. In the event that such records are not available at the time such request is made, Defendant shall provide such Training Rosters to the requesting party within three business days.

## 4.4.b.4 With regard to each Halloween City Facility:

- d. Defendant shall maintain a copy of the Training Roster evidencing each store management personnel's receipt of training within fourteen days (14) from the start of employment in that position. Such records shall be maintained at each Halloween City Facility where the employee provides any labor or services or in the case of an employee who provides labor or services for more than one location, at the employee's primary work location, to be designated by Defendant, regardless of the duration of the employee's employment. Defendant shall, at each Halloween City Facility, maintain a copy of that facility's Training Roster for the period of time the Halloween City Facility is owned, leased or operated. In the event that such Training Rosters are not available during a governmental inspection of a Halloween City Facility, Defendant shall provide such Training Rosters to the inspector by the close of the following business day. For five (5) years from the date the training was conducted, Defendant shall maintain a copy of that Training Roster at corporate headquarters to be available upon request by governmental agencies.
- Defendant shall promptly make available upon request by any CUPA
   Inspector, peace officer, agent of the Department of Justice,
   California Environmental Protection Agency, the DTSC, or District

Attorney all Training Rosters for each Facility. In the event that such records are not available at the time such request is made, Defendant shall provide such records to the requesting party within five (5) days of receipt of the request.

4.4.c. Waste Audits—retail stores. Defendant shall conduct on an annual basis, through an independent third-party auditor, audits of at least ten percent (10%) of their then existing Party City Facilities and at least five percent (5%) of their then existing Halloween City Facilities to assure their ongoing compliance with the requirements of this Final Judgment. In determining the number of PC/HC Facilities requiring an audit for a calendar year, the auditor shall make the calculation using the number of Party City Facilities that were open as of January 1 of that calendar year and the number of Halloween City Facilities that were open as of September 15 of that calendar year. Each audit shall include an unannounced inspection of the PC/HC Facilities' trash containers, dumpster(s), hazardous-waste storage area(s), and compactor(s). Notice of the findings of such audits shall be provided to Defendant.

4.4.c.1. In the event an independent third-party audit finds any violation(s) of Chapter 6.5 or Chapter 6.95 of Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code, or the regulations promulgated under these chapters, Defendant shall, within 30 days of receiving notice of a finding, deliver a notice detailing the violation(s) to each employee employed at the facility where any violation was found and provide a brief training to remind each employee how to properly handle hazardous waste and to ensure the cited violation does not re-occur.

## 4.4.c.2. For Party City Facilities Only.

a. In the event an independent third-party audit finds fifty percent (50%) or more of the Party City Facilities inspected during a calendar year have one or more violations of Chapter 6.5 or Chapter 6.95 of Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code, or the regulations promulgated under these chapters, Defendant shall, within 90 days of receiving notice of a finding, (1) require that every

employee at Party City Facilities with violations, whose responsibilities include hazardous-waste management, complete a refresher course on compliance with California hazardous waste and hazardous material law, and (2) deliver to every employee at all Party City Facilities a notice reminding each employee how to properly handle hazardous waste.

b. In the event an independent third-party audit finds seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the Party City Facilities inspected during a calendar year have one or more violations of Chapter 6.5 or Chapter 6.95 of Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code, or the regulations promulgated under these chapters, Defendant shall, within 90 days of receiving notice of reaching this seventy-five percent (75%) or more threshold level: (1) require that every employee at Party City Facilities, whose responsibilities include hazardous-waste management, complete a refresher course on compliance with California hazardous waste and hazardous material law; (2) provide the notices required in the above paragraph 4.4.b.2; and (3) deliver to each regional manager and district manager a notice stating that seventy-five percent (75%) of the Party City Facilities audited had one or more violations of Chapter 6.5 or Chapter 6.95 of Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code, or the regulations promulgated under those chapters.

4.4.d. By September 15 of each year, Defendant shall provide to the People's representatives as set forth in Exhibit B, a complete list of all Halloween City Facilities in operation for that calendar year. This list shall include the address, manager name, and EPA ID # for each Halloween City facility.

# 5. CIVIL PENALTIES, SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS, AND COSTS

#### 5.1. Civil Penalties

Within twenty-one (21) business days after entry of this Final Judgment, Defendant shall pay SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$637,500.00) as civil penalties pursuant to Health and Safety Code sections 25189 and 25515 and Business and Professions Code section 17206, in accordance with the terms of Exhibits B-1 and B-2.

## 5.2. Supplemental Environmental Projects

Within twenty-one (21) business days after entry of this Final Judgment, Defendant shall pay ONE HUNDRED SIX THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$106,250.00) for supplemental environmental projects identified in, and in accordance with the terms of, Exhibit C.

## 5.3. Reimbursement of Costs of Investigation and Enforcement

Within twenty-one (21) business days after entry of this Final Judgment, Defendant shall pay ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$135,000.00) for reimbursement of attorney's fees, costs of investigation, and other costs of enforcement, to the entities identified in, and in accordance with the terms of, Exhibits D-1 and D-2.

## 5.4. Payments and Expenditures

The payment of all civil penalties, reimbursement of cost payments, and other expenditures set forth in Paragraphs 5.1, 5.2, and 5.3, above, shall be made by checks and delivered to the District Attorney's Office for the County of Yolo, Attention: David Irey, for distribution pursuant to the terms of this Final Judgment.

#### 6. MATTERS COVERED BY THIS FINAL JUDGMENT

- 6.1. This Final Judgment is a final and binding resolution and settlement of all claims, violations and causes of action arising from the matters and allegations set forth in the Complaint as to Defendant's PC/HC Facilities listed in Exhibits A-1 and A-2, and shall be known as "Covered Matters."
- 6.2. Any claim, violation, or cause of action that is not a Covered Matter is a "Reserved' Claim." Reserved Claims include, without limitation, any violation that occurs after the filing of this

Final Judgment; any claim, violation, or cause of action against Defendant's independent contractors or subcontractors; and separate and independent violations arising out of matters or allegations that are not set forth in the Complaint, whether known or unknown. Reserved Claims also include any claims or causes of action against Defendant for performance of cleanup, corrective action, or response action for any actual past or future releases, spills, or disposals of hazardous waste or hazardous substances that were caused or contributed to by Defendant at or from any of Defendant's PC/HC Facilities.

- 6.3. In any subsequent action that may be brought by the People based on any Reserved Claim, Defendant cannot assert that failing to pursue any Reserved Claim as part of this action constitutes claim-splitting. This paragraph does not affect any statute of limitations, if any, which may be applicable to any Reserved Claim, and does not prohibit Defendant from asserting any statute of limitations or other legal or equitable defenses that may be applicable to any Reserved Claim.
- 6.4. Defendant covenants not to pursue any civil or administrative claims against the People or against any agency of the State of California, or any county or city in the State of California, or any CUPA, Participating Agency or local agency (collectively, "Agencies"), or against any of their officers, employees, representatives, agents, or attorneys, arising out of or related to any Covered Matter and arising before entry of this Final Judgment; provided, however, that if any Agencies initiate claims against Defendant, Defendant retains any and all rights and defenses against such Agencies.

## 7. EFFECT OF FINAL JUDGMENT

Except as expressly provided in this Final Judgment, nothing in this Final Judgment is intended, nor shall it be construed, to preclude the People or any state, county, city or local agency, department, board, or CUPA from exercising its authority under any law, statute, or regulation.

## 8. NO WAIVER OF RIGHT TO ENFORCE

The failure of the People to enforce any provision of this Final Judgment shall neither be deemed a waiver of such provision nor in any way affect the validity of this Final Judgment. The failure of the People to enforce any such provision shall not preclude them from later enforcing the same or any other provision of this Final Judgment. Except as expressly provided in this Final

Judgment, Defendant retains all defenses to any such later enforcement action. Prior to taking any action to enforce the injunctive provisions of this Final Judgment by civil contempt or pursuant to California Business and Professions Code section 17207, the Yolo County District Attorney's Office shall provide Defendants with at least ten (10) days' notice before filing any such action.

#### 9. INTERPRETATION

This Final Judgment was drafted equally by all Parties hereto. Accordingly, any and all rules of construction holding that ambiguity is construed against the drafting party shall not apply to the interpretation of this Final Judgment.

#### 10. INTEGRATION

This Final Judgment constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and may not be amended or supplemented except as provided for herein. No oral advice, guidance, suggestions, or comments by employees or officials of any Party regarding matters covered in this Final Judgment shall be construed to relieve any Party of its obligations under this Final Judgment. No oral representations have been made or relied upon other than as expressly set forth herein.

## 11. FUTURE REGULATORY CHANGES

Nothing in this Final Judgment shall excuse Defendant from meeting any more-stringent requirement that may be imposed by applicable existing law or by any change in the applicable law. To the extent any future statutory or regulatory change makes Defendant's obligations less stringent than those provided for in this Final Judgment, Defendant's compliance with the changed law shall be deemed compliance with this Final Judgment; however, any change in law or regulation shall not reduce or diminish Defendant's obligations to comply with Paragraph 4.4.

#### 12. TERMINATION OF COMPLIANCE PROGRAM

Defendant's obligations to engage in a compliance program pursuant to Paragraph 4.4 of this Final Judgment shall terminate five (5) years after the Effective Date of this Final Judgment, provided that Defendant has already paid and expended all amounts required under the Final Judgment.

#### 13. NOTICE

Unless otherwise specified in this Final Judgment, all notices under this Final Judgment shall

be made in writing, by both email and mail, and addressed to the persons identified in Exhibit B.

Any Party may, by written notice to the other Parties, change its designated notice recipient or notice address.

#### 14. CONTINUING JURISDICTION

The Court shall retain continuing jurisdiction to enforce the injunctive terms of this Final Judgment and to address any other matters arising out of or regarding this Final Judgment.

#### 15. ABILITY TO INSPECT AND COPY RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS

Defendant shall permit any duly authorized representative of the People to inspect and copy records and documents relevant to determine compliance with the terms of this Final Judgment. This paragraph shall not limit the People's authority access or obtain information, records, and documents pursuant to any other statute or regulation.

## 16. PAYMENT OF LITIGATION EXPENSES AND FEES

Defendant shall make no request of the People to pay its attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs, or any other costs of litigation or investigation incurred to date.

## 17. COUNTERPART SIGNATURES

The stipulation for entry of this Final Judgment may be executed by the Parties in counterparts. For purposes of this Final Judgment, facsimile signatures shall be deemed originals, and the parties agree to exchange original signatures as promptly as possible.

#### 18. INCORPORATION OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits "A" through "D-2" are incorporated herein by reference.

#### 19. MODIFICATION

The injunctive provisions of this Final Judgment may be modified only on noticed motion by one of the Parties with approval of the Court, or upon stipulation by the Parties and the approval of the Court.

#### 20. TERMINATION OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION

At any time after this Final Judgment has been in effect for five (5) years, and Defendant has paid and expended all amounts required under the Final Judgment, Defendant may move to terminate the injunctive provisions in Paragraphs 4.2 and 4.3 pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 533

### 4. California District Attorneys Association Environmental Project.

PARTY CITY CORPORATION shall provide the amount of Fifteen Thousand

Dollars (\$15,000.00) to be used by the California District Attorneys Association

Environmental Project for the purpose of providing training consistent with the objectives of the Environmental Project.

<sup>\*</sup> If the payment provided by the PARTY CITY CORPORATION is accepted by a designated entity, the designated entity shall provide, until the exhaustion of the funds, annual letter reports describing the specific use of the funds. The annual letter reports shall be submitted to the Plaintiff's representatives identified in this Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment and Permanent Injunction.
