
Section 1.302
Application for Permit - All applications for a permit required by this Code shall be made to the Bureau of Fire Prevention in such form and detail as it shall prescribe. Applications for permits shall be accompanied by such plans as required by the Bureau.














Fire Code Strategy

































Fire Code State law directs SFM to adopt regulations, including for hazardous materials. Enforcement: • Single family homes: Fire or Building • State owned/occupied: SFM or Campus FM • All other: Local Fire Agency • To greatest extent practicable regular, full time fire department employees • Cities cannot use GC 34004 for SFM regulations (Fire Code and Title 19)





For compressed gases:

- determine if threshold quantities exceeded at STP
- report in the physical state at which it is stored. (EHS in pounds)


