Satellite Accumulation

(storage for >90 days without permit)




- Limited quantity:
 - □ Acute wastes/EHW : 1-qt/1-kg
 - □ Nonacute wastes: 55 gallons
- At or near point of generation
- Under the control of the operator

- MARKING and dating:
 - "Hazardous Waste"
 - Initial accumulation start date
 - Generator name/address
 - Composition and physical state
 - Indication of hazard(s)
 - Excess quantity date (if applicable)

SAA Containers

Examples: Indication of the Hazard









Words identifying an applicable characteristic

DOT label or placard

OSHA hazard statement or pictogram

NFPA Code 704 chemical hazard label



Satellite Accumulation

- Containers closed except:
 - Adding, removing, or consolidating waste
 - Venting for safety
- Waste Compatibility
- Accumulation up to one year without a permit

See §66262.15

SAA REQs

- Preparedness and prevention
- Contingency plan (LQGs)
- Emergency procedures

See §66262.15, RU 6.2, RO 14703, 14826

Laboratory Accumulation

- Accumulation limits same as SAA
- Laboratory accumulation area
 - As close as practical to POG
 - In lab room or another onsite location
- One-year time limit
- Less labeling than SAAs



90/180/270-Day Accumulation

(longer accumulation requires a higher-tier permit)

Allowed units:

- Containers
- Tanks
- Drip pads
- Containment buildings

Articles 27, 28, and 28.5 for LQGs

Pretransport Reqs.

- Packaging
- Labeling
- Marking
- Placarding

See Chapter 12, Article 3

What's new post-GIR?

- LQG QRG
- Few other changes pre- to post-GIR
 - Mostly reorganizes reqs. into §§66262.15–17

- Didn't adopt episodic generation provisions
- VSQGs reg. nearly same as SQGs, no §66262.14
- Extra labeling (e.g., gen. name, start date)
- No drip pads/containment buildings for SQGs
- No drip pads for LQGs

- No 24-hour emergency response waiver
- SQG >1-kg acute/extremely HW 90-day limit
- Accum. time extension for non-RCRA HW
- No Foo6 accum. time extension for LQGs
- No waiver Doo1/Doo3 wastes within 15 meters of property line for LQGs

- LQGs can't consolidate HW from VSQGs
- LQG rejected and returned hazardous waste must be labeled as rejected
- LQG training must comply with 8 CCR §5192(p)
 - Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response

- SQG 180-day accum. time begins:
 - If ≤100 kg non-acute or ≤1 kg acute/EHW generated in a month, then begins when >100 kg/1 kg accumulates
 - If generated >100 kg non-acute HW in a month, then begins when that amount first accumulates
- No adoption of §262.35 liquid in landfills ban; §66262.25 procedures for accum. time extensions
