
DEFINITIONS



What is storm water?

- ACT
- REPUBLIC

- Rain, snow or ice melt runoff
- Water with a final destination of a stream, river, lake or ocean
- Water that does not seep into the ground
- Water that is channeled by storm sewers and drains





What causes stormwater pollution?





- Oils
- Antifreeze
- Detergents
- Industrial waste
- Trash
- Dust
- Cigarette butts
- Animal droppings

REGULATIONS



The Clean Water Act





- 1972: Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
- Establishes framework for regulating storm water under National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program
- Federal Regulations:
 - 40 CFR Sections 122-125 National Pollutant Discharge Regulations
 - 40 CFR Part 122.6 Storm Water Discharges (Subject to NPDES program)
 - 40 CFR Subchapter N National effluent limitation guidelines



Who controls California's storm water? ACT



- ➤ Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
 - ➤ Federal Water Pollution Control Act (Clean Water Act)
 - ➤ Section 402: National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program
 - State Water Resources Board
 - ➤ Regional Water Quality Control Boards (RWQCBs)

NPDES Program - Permits





- 1. Municipal General Permit
 - Large and small municipal sewer system operators (military bases, hospitals, public campuses, etc.)
- 2. Construction General Permit
 - Projects that disturb one or more acres of soil

3. Industrial Storm Water General Permit

(Order 2014-0057-DWQ, last amended in July 1,2020)

Facilities must file a permit if they have a specific SIC
 code or conduct certain activities outdoors











NOI coverage



- Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)
 - Possible sources of pollution
 - Best management practices (BMPs)
 - Storm water sampling team
 - Reporting requirements
 - Direction of flow of storm water
- A plan written by the facility or outside

centractor.

Why are we sampling for?



- NPDES requires storm water sampling based upon:
 - Standard Industrial Code (SIC); or/and
 - Your facility's receiving waters
 - Are you discharging to an impaired water (303d Listed Water Body)?
- The IGP outlines all storm water sampling specifications

Why are we sampling for?





 All facilities in the state of California filing for an NOI under the industrial general permit must sample for:

- ➤ Total Suspended Solids (TSS) → ELAP Certified Lab
 - ➤ Oil and Grease (O&G) → ELAP Certified Lab
 - → pH → in-house

 - 4. Prompt spill clean up





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- Authorized non-storm water discharges (NSWDs)
 - Water line/hydrant flushing
 - Dechlorinated swimming pool water
 - Landscape irrigation/lawn watering
 - Groundwater
 - Air conditioning compressor condensate
 - Uncontaminated footer drains
 - Drinking fountains



 - O Certified in SMARTS?









- What parameters are we sampling?
 - SIC code
 - Impairments
- Proper sampling techniques
- PPE
- Certified ELAP lab
- Recordkeeping
- Qualifying Storm Events
 - Two samples July-Dec
 - Two samples Jan-June
 - Representative sample?











NOI- Sampling

- ACT enviro
- REPUBLIC

- What if I can't sample?
 - Not enough rain
 - QSE did not occur during facility operating hours
 - Event was not preceded by 48 hours of dry weather
 - Issues with sampling equipment
 - Dangerous weather or conditions

NOI- Exceedances





- Based on level status
 - Baseline
 - Annual Comprehensive Evaluation and Report; by July 15th
 - o Level 1
 - Annual Comprehensive Evaluation and Report;
 - Level 1 Exceedance Response Action (ERA) Plan; by Jan 1st
 - o Level 2
 - Annual Comprehensive Evaluation and Report; by July 15th
 - Level 2 ERA Plan; by Jan 1st
 - Level 2 ERA Technical Report; by Jan 1st



NOI- Exceedances





- Advanced BMPs
- Eligibility for returning to Baseline
 - Status is assigned by parameter
 - o Additional BMPs have been implemented
 - Four (4) consecutive QSEs with no additional exceedances
 - ERA reports MUST be prepared by a QISP



NOI- Implementation of BMPs

- ACT
- REPUBLIC

- Laboratory reports
 - ELAP certified
 - Results will be released within 1-4 weeks
 - Upload and Certify in SMARTS within 30 days
- Retain copies for 5 years
- PPE

CALIFORNIA

- Certified ELAP lab
- Recordkeeping
- Qualifying Storm Events
 - Two samples July-Dec
 - Two samples Jan-June

NOI-SMARTS Reporting & Recordkeeping





- Sampling and Analysis
 - ELAP certified
 - Results will be released within 1-4 weeks
 - Upload and Certify in SMARTS within 30 days
- Monthly visual observations
- Sampling event observations
- Annual Reports
- Specific ERA reports
- All records MUST be retained for 5 years
- Pay annual fee



NEC-SMARTS Reporting & Recordkeeping





- Maintain NEC conditions
- Recertify annually by Oct 1st.
- Pay annual fee

Corrective actions requested by the Board.

To demonstrate compliance with the Industrial General Permit, submit the following documents to the Attachments in SMARTS no later than 11 April 2025:

- 1. Photos showing that trash and debris have been cleaned up around the site.
- Photos showing that the temporary bins have either been removed from the site or covered.
- Upload an updated SWPPP and map that includes the stormwater pipe conveyance and new facility information.



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CASE #3





Corrective actions requested by the Board.

Even though the site is in baseline status for all required parameters, it is recommended that you re-evaluate your BMP installed at sample location SP-1 as the amount of runoff that flows through this location could render the BMP ineffective quickly.

In response to these inspection findings, please complete the following:

 Install and maintain perimeter sediment control BMPs in both sample locations SP-1 and SP-2 (see Inspection Report Photos 1 and 2). Ensure that the BMPs are installed to capture any runoff from the Site.





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GOOD NEWS!





 A Facility can move from NOI to NEC coverage as soon as no exposure conditions are met.

- Know your Role in your company and the community
- Know the type of coverage at your site
 - NEC
 - o NOI
- Continuous implementation and maintenance of B
- Identify new sources of pollution
- If uncertain.....Notify, Notify, Notify
